Our count of veterans and their families VR has helped since opening in July of 2020, 322.

Of these new and returning Veterans, we have helped:

160 with food, 64 with gas cards, 1 with a car,
9 with bikes, 58 with food cards, 276 with
clothing, 116 with furniture, 50 with laundry and/or
shower, 4 with phones, 12 with computers,
13 with city bus passes, 18 with hotel rooms,
3 Greyhound bus tickets, and 36with misc.
expenses such as water bills, gas bills, car tags,
car insurance, & rent deposits.

26 of these veterans have a family and 127 are over 55 years of age.
